*Willow in a Storm: An Odyssey*  
Through the Failing Penal System

MINNEAPOLIS (MARCH 2008) – Scarletta Press introduces *Willow in a Storm* (Scarletta Press, 978-0-9765201-5-3, September 2007), a raw, unflinching memoir of prison life and post-prison hope.

With the help of his wife Kathleen Murphy-Taylor, James Peter Taylor recounts the events of his unusual life, over forty years of which he spent incarcerated. Mentally and sexually abused by his adoptive father, he receives a life sentence at age 30 when he unintentionally kills a Minnesota man during a robbery gone awry.

Despite the rampant violence, Taylor manages to survive in prison in part by playing a woman's role, a gender switch that becomes second nature. After decades behind bars, a wiser and more spiritual Taylor gains his parole in the 1990s at age 70. Partially blind, he re-enters civilian life with Kathy Murphy-Taylor, a former social worker, and with a new sense of both present and future. *Willow in a Storm* demonstrates hope even in the most dismal of circumstances.
